In past years, the Guild has donated finished quilts to Project Linus, Mission Hospital, SECU Cancer Center, Brother Wolf, the NC State Veterans Home, MAHEC, Meals on Wheels, Steadfast House, and Habitat for Humanity. In addition to quilts, members have donated preemie hats to the NICU, pillows to the Care Partners Hospice, weighted blankets to Project Linus, and adult bibs and placemats to Meals on Wheels. We also offer activities to cancer patients and survivors at Camp Bluebird.
